Title:	Carry out road construction and maintenance activities using a tip truck	
Level: 3		Credits: 8

Purpose

This unit standard is intended for those who work in road construction and maintenance operations. People holding credit for this unit standard are able to: Plan and prepare for work; start and shut down tip truck haul and tip material; perform maintenance and authorised service operations on the tip truck; complete work related documents; and clean up work area.

Being credited with this unit standard does not enable a person to drive the vehicle on an open, public road. In order to do so, a person must be in possession of a valid and current driving licence relevant to this vehicle type.

Special Notes

1. Entry information:
 - Prerequisite
 - Unit 712 - *Comply with health, safety and environmental rules and regulations in road construction and maintenance work operations*
2. Expected worksite production target are to be met.
3. Assessment evidence may be collected from a real workplace, a simulated workplace or an appropriately simulated environment in which road construction and maintenance operations are carried out.
4. The credit allocated for this unit standard assumes that the candidate has the required drivers licence.
5. Equipment, tools and materials may include but are not limited to tip truck machine guidance system, fuel and specified oil and lubricants, and accessory tools.
6. Truck refers to a rigid frame vehicle, typically with a 3 -16 cubic metre load capacity.
7. Maintenance may include but is not limited to cleaning, authorised servicing and the monitoring, recording and reporting of faults. It may also include the conduct of authorised minor replacements and the provision of assistance to maintenance and repair activities.
8. Safe working practices include but are not limited to day-to-day observation of safety policies and procedures, and compliance with emergency procedures.

9. Performance of all elements in this unit standard must comply with all relevant legal and workplace requirements, contractual agreement and/or manufacturers' specifications.
10. Regulations and legislation relevant to this unit standard may include but are not limited to the following:
 - Labour Act, No. 11 of 2007
 - Occupational Health and Safety Regulations No. 18, 1997
 - Road Traffic and Transport Regulations No. 52, 1999 and Government Notice No 53 Road Traffic and Transport Regulations
 - Road Ordinance 1972 and other relevant legislations and all subsequent amendments.

Elements and Performance Criteria

Element 1: Plan and prepare for work

Performance Criteria

- 1.1 Work instructions, including plans, specifications, quality requirements and operational details are obtained, explained, clarified and applied to the allocated task.
- 1.2 Safety requirements, including personal protective clothing and equipment are obtained from the site safety plan, workplace policies and procedures, and applied to the allocated task.
- 1.3 Traffic control requirements are obtained and implemented according to workplace requirements.
- 1.4 Plant, tools, fuel, lubricants, equipment, attachments and accessories selected to carry out tasks are checked for consistency with the requirements of the job, their usability and any faults rectified or reported prior to commencement of work.
- 1.5 Environmental protection requirements are identified from the project environmental management plan and applied to the allocated task.

Element 2: Start and shut down tip truck

Performance Criteria

- 2.1 Pre-operational checks are carried out according to appropriate checklist and workplace procedures.

- 2.2 Daily and weekly operator maintenance is performed according to appropriate checklist and workplace procedures.
- 2.3 Start-up and shutdown procedures are followed according to manufacturer's specifications.
- 2.4 Operating hours are recorded, if required, in accordance with workplace requirements.
- 2.5 Tip truck maintenance and faults are reported in accordance with workplace requirements.

Element 3: Haul and tip material

Range

This element does not include spreading of material once the truck is in motion.

Performance Criteria

- 3.1 Relevant work instructions are obtained according to workplace requirements.
- 3.2 The load is checked as being secured, balanced and within capacity according to the work instruction, manufacturers' specifications and legal requirements.
- 3.3 Material is transported to the designated site.
- 3.4 Material is off loaded according to work instructions and manufacturers' specifications.
- 3.5 Safe working procedures are followed according to manufacturers' specifications, site specific and statutory requirements.
- 3.6 Tip truck is operated without risk of damage or loss to tip truck or property, third party, or injury to people.
- 3.7 Hauling and tipping operations are integrated with other on-site activities.
- 3.8 Where haulage is on public roads, road rules and courtesies are observed and adhered to.
- 3.9 Hazards specific to operating tip trucks and ways to minimise these are explained in terms of potential damage to tip truck and property, third party and injury to people.

Element 4: Perform maintenance and authorised service operations on the tip truck

Performance Criteria

- 4.1 Tip truck is maintained and serviced in accordance with the workplace requirements and manufacturer's procedures.

Element 5: Complete work related documents

Performance Criteria

- 5.1 Work related documents are completed in accordance with contract and workplace requirements.
- 5.2 Maintenance and service related documents are completed in accordance with manufacturer and workplace requirements.
- 5.3 Documents related to accidents or other incidents are completed in accordance with workplace requirements.

Element 6: Clean up work area

Performance Criteria

- 6.1 Work area is cleared and materials disposed of or recycled in accordance with project environment management plan.
- 6.2 Truck, tools and equipments are cleaned, checked, maintained, serviced and stored in accordance with manufacturers' recommendations and standard work practices.
- 6.3 Unused materials are safely stored and stacked for future use.
