Title:	Make a marker

Purpose

This unit standard specifies the competencies required to make a marker. It includes preparing the workstation, drafting a lay marker, copying a marker and storing the master copy of marker. This unit standard is intended for people who work in an industrial clothing production environment.

Special Notes

1. Entry information
Prerequisite:
 - Unit 130 *Follow workplace safety procedures in a clothing production environment* or demonstrated equivalent knowledge and skills.
2. To demonstrate competence, at a minimum, evidence is required of making a lay marker, making a copy of the marker and storing the master copy of the marker. These tasks must be performed ensuring correct identification of requirements and finishing of the tasks, correct selection and use of appropriate processes, tools and equipment and completing all work to specification.
3. Assessment evidence may be collected from a real workplace or a simulated real workplace or an appropriate simulated realistic environment in which clothing production operations are carried out.
4. Performance of all elements in this unit standard must comply with all relevant workplace requirements and /or manufacturer's specifications.
5. Regulations and legislation relevant to this unit standard include the following:
 - Labour Act, No. 6, 1992
 - Occupational Health and Safety Regulations No. 18, 1997
 and all subsequent amendments.

Elements and Performance Criteria

Element 1: Prepare work station

Performance Criteria

- 1.1 Workstation is cleaned and set up in line with workplace specifications.
- 1.2 Appropriate equipment and tools are selected in line with workplace specifications.

Element 2: Draft lay marker

Performance Criteria

- 2.1 Cutting order is interpreted for marking requirements such as fabric type, width, quantity and garment sizes according to workplace specifications.
- 2.2 Required pattern pieces are collected and positioned on paper.

Element 3: Copy marker

Performance Criteria

- 3.1 Marker is checked against order requirements.
- 3.2 Marker is copied according to workplace specifications.

Element 4: Store master copy of marker

Performance Criteria

- 4.1 Master copy of lay marker is stored according to workplace specifications.
