Title:	Lift and place loads with ship-to-shore container crane

Purpose

This unit standard is intended for those who carry out crane operations. People holding credit for this unit standard are able to: Plan and prepare for work; demonstrate knowledge of the functions of a ship-to-shore container crane; start and shutdown ship-to-shore container crane; operate ship-to-shore container crane; perform maintenance and authorised service operations on the ship-to-shore container crane; complete work related documents; and clean up work area.

Special Notes

1. Entry information:
 - Prerequisite
 - Unit 1079 – *Comply with health, safety and environmental rules and regulations pertaining to crane operations.*
2. Expected worksite production target are to be met.
3. Assessment evidence may be collected from a real workplace or a simulated workplace in which crane operations are carried out.
4. Maintenance may include but is not limited to cleaning, authorised servicing and the monitoring, recording and reporting of faults. It may also include the conduct of authorised minor replacements and the provision of assistance to maintenance and repair activities.
5. Safe working practices include but are not limited to day-to-day observation of safety policies and procedures, and compliance with emergency procedures.
6. Performance of all elements in this unit standard must comply with all relevant legal and workplace requirements, contractual agreement and/or manufacturers' specifications.
7. Regulations and legislation, including subsequent amendments, relevant to this unit standard may include but are not limited to the following:
 - Labour Act, No. 11 of 2007
 - Regulations relating to the Health and Safety of employees at work, 1997 and all industry specific regulations, legislations, code of practice, or code of conduct.

Elements and Performance Criteria

Element 1: Plan and prepare for work

Range

Inspection and preparation of work area and equipment may include but is not limited to proximity of other machines and personnel; stability and suitability of crane; operational capability of lifting equipment such as correct safe working load of slings; and compliance with statutory regulations.

Performance Criteria

- 1.1 Work instructions, including plans, specifications, quality requirements and operational details are obtained, explained, clarified and applied to the allocated task.
- 1.2 Safety requirements, including personal protective clothing and equipment are obtained from the site safety plan, workplace policies and procedures, and applied to the allocated task.
- 1.3 Plant, tools, fuel, lubricants, equipment, attachments and accessories selected to carry out tasks are checked for consistency with the requirements of the job, their usability and any faults rectified or reported prior to commencement of work.
- 1.4 Environmental protection requirements are identified from the project environmental management plan and applied to the allocated task.
- 1.5 Work area and equipment is inspected and prepared according to workplace procedures.

Element 2: Demonstrate knowledge of the functions of a ship-to-shore container crane

Range

Instrumentation and safety devices may include but are not limited to gauges; indicators; warning devices; and plc systems (Programmable Logic Controller).

Performance Criteria

- 2.1 The ship-to-shore container cranes and their use are described according to the different types of cranes in a category.
- 2.2 The limitations, capabilities and capacities of the ship-to-shore container crane to be operated are explained in accordance with manufacturer's specifications.
- 2.3 The operation of all major components is explained in terms of their functions.

- 2.4 The systems of the ship-to-shore container crane are described in terms of their features, functions and interrelatedness.
- 2.5 Instrumentation and safety features of the ship-to-shore container crane are identified, and their purposes explained in accordance with manufacturer's specifications.
- 2.6 Corrective actions are described or demonstrated in terms of responses to warnings received.

Element 3: Start and shutdown ship-to-shore container crane

Range

Appropriate checklist may include but is not limited to manufacturer's checklist; pre-operational checklist; site-specific checklist; daily checklist; and weekly checklist.

Performance Criteria

- 3.1 Pre-operational checks are carried out according to appropriate checklist and workplace procedures.
- 3.2 Start-up and shutdown procedures are followed according to manufacturer's specifications.
- 3.3 Ship-to-shore container crane operation hours are recorded, if required, in accordance with workplace requirements.

Element 4: Operate ship-to-shore container crane

Range

Criteria may include but are not limited to density; dimensions; centre of gravity; stability and temperature of a suspended load; and hazardous material.

Handle may include but is not limited to identifying; lifting; stacking; travelling; and re-handling of containers.

Performance Criteria

- 4.1 The physical properties of a container are identified and confirmed according to criteria.
- 4.2 Functions of the various controls are demonstrated in accordance with manufacturer's specifications.
- 4.3 Principles of operations/leverage are applied to ensure safe and effective lifting operation.
- 4.4 Load capacity of the ship-to-shore container crane and its load are determined as per standard operating procedures.
- 4.5 Controls are used to efficiently handle loads within workplace requirements and manufacturer's specifications.

- 4.6 Communication channels are applied and maintained during ship-to-shore container crane operations.

Element 5: Perform maintenance and authorised service operations on the ship-to-shore container crane

Performance Criteria

- 5.1 Daily and weekly operator maintenance is performed according to the appropriate post-operational checklist and recordkeeping using a logbook.
- 5.2 Ship-to-shore container crane maintenance and faults are reported in accordance with workplace requirements.

Element 6: Complete work related documents

Performance Criteria

- 6.1 Work related documents are completed in accordance with contract and workplace requirements.
- 6.2 Maintenance and service related documents are completed in accordance with manufacturer and workplace requirements.
- 6.3 Documents related to accidents or other incidents are completed in accordance with workplace requirements.

Element 7: Clean up work area

Performance Criteria

- 7.1 Work area is cleared and materials disposed of or recycled in accordance with project environment management plan.
- 7.2 Plant, tools and equipments are cleaned, checked, maintained, serviced and stored in accordance with manufacturers' recommendations and standard work practices.
- 7.3 Inspection, faultfinding, and reporting is carried out according to manufacturer's requirements and workplace procedures.
