- 1.2 Instructions of the team leader are followed promptly and correctly.
- 1.3 All assigned tasks are carried out in a well-coordinated manner with other team members.
- 1.4 Work instructions, including plans, specifications, quality requirements and operational details are obtained, explained, clarified and applied to the allocated task.
- 1.5 Safety requirements including personal protective clothing and equipment, are obtained from the site safety plan, workplace policies and procedures, and applied to the allocated task.
- 1.6 Traffic control requirements are obtained and implemented according to workplace requirements.
- 1.7 Plants, tools and equipment selected to carry out tasks are checked for consistency with the requirements of the job, their usability and any faults rectified or reported prior to commencement.
- 1.8 Environmental protection requirements are identified from the project environmental management plan confirmed and applied to the allocated task.

Performance Criteria

- 2.1 Team members are supported in meeting expected outcomes.
- 2.3 Team members are encouraged to participate in a continuous process of planning and decision making in accordance with workplace requirements and work progress.
